Paving a Path Forward, **Together**

ITH MANY STREETS AND CAPITAL improvement projects in the works, it's shaping up to be another busy, but exciting, fiscal year.

In August, the City hosted its annual Spotlight Breakfast, highlighting the accomplishments of Fiscal Year 2023-2024 and what it's working towards in the next year. One thing that was clear, is that we could not have achieved what we have on our own.

First, we stand on the backs of all of those who have done the hard work before us. None more so perhaps than former mayor Rick Mueller, whose passing this year was felt deeply throughout the community.

Besides being known for showing up to work in shorts and a Hawaiian shirt, Mueller is remembered as a champion for our community and its residents, and for veterans throughout the State of Arizona. He was a public servant for the City of Sierra Vista for 22 years, 12 of which as mayor.

Mueller's legacy is one of unwavering dedication, and we strive to continue to collaborate with our partners to build on his good works.

This next fiscal year, the City has budgeted for the streetscape project on North Garden Avenue in the West End. Revitalization of the historic area is a longterm project with many pieces, but the City is excited to continue progress in the area.

Another exciting project is the upcoming reconstruction of portions of Buffalo Soldier Trail. Senators Kelly and Sinema and Representative Ciscomani worked together to secure \$4 million in appropriations towards the project, and Rep. Ciscomani is advocating for more federal funding.

The City will also begin work to reconstruct part of Martin Luther King, Jr. Parkway and the Arizona Department of Transportation has begun construction on Highway 90 from the Border Patrol checkpoint to Moson Road—which I know will make many residents happy.

Meanwhile, the expansion of the Nancy J. Brua Animal Care Center is underway, ensuring the center can continue to do critical work serving animals and people in our community.

A large local donation and grant funding have transformed the Henry F. Hauser Museum, as well. It has just reopened after an 11-month remodel giving the museum renewed life and purpose as it now

boasts a new Children's Discovery Room and 50% more space.

Although the City often gets credit for these capital improvement projects, it has only been through working with partners on the federal, state, and local level,



and with a generous outpouring of support from the community, that the City has been able to reap what so many have worked together to sow.

Sometimes that work is as simple as public support. City Council was moved this past July by the outpouring of encouragement from residents advocating for the City to acquire the Pueblo del Sol golf course. Those same residents and PDS staff continue to lend support as the country club begins its transition into a municipal course.

The City has also benefited greatly from its partnerships with local sports organizations whose clubs and leagues bring athletes and their families to our community where they stay, frequenting local businesses and boosting our economy. Between 2019 and 2023, total estimated revenue from sports tourism is \$2,960,384.32 with a total estimated economic impact of \$7,016,110.83.

Another important partner over the last year is the Arizona Commerce Authority, which helped us bring ALLO Fiber and BlackStar Orbital Technologies to Sierra Vista. Having more options for high-speed internet service is great for our residents, and the commitment from BlackStar, in combination with the City's efforts to become a spaceport reentry site, have important implications not only for Sierra Vista, but for the state as we break into the space economy.

There are many exciting projects and possibilities on the horizon this year, and I look forward to working with our partners to continue to invest our community and its residents.

Shelter Expansion Underway



XCITING DEVELOPMENTS ARE ON THE horizon for the Nancy J. Brua Animal Care Center as a significant expansion addresses the growing need for more kennel space and improved facilities. The construction project, which marks a critical step in enhancing the shelter's capabilities, comes in response to increased pet intakes and the challenges of managing a low-kill policy—only euthanizing when necessary for public safety or to prevent pets from suffering.

The new development includes 18 additional kennels: 14 for adoptable dogs and four dedicated to quarantine. The latter will enable the shelter to better separate sick or behavioral issue dogs from the general population, improving their health and management. Construction is expected to be finished in mid to late October.

Currently, the shelter operates with 69 kennels, including those for small dogs and overflow. Despite these resources, it frequently nears full capacity due to rising costs and the increased number of pets being surrendered.

"For the past few years, we've been almost at capacity every single month," Animal Control Supervisor Arleen Garcia says.

To alleviate capacity issues, the shelter works with the community and boarding facilities to place animals when needed. However, a low-kill policy means longer lengths of stay for many canines, especially those with minor behavioral issues. Many

animals are turned in for having non-perfect traits, which can be fixed with training.

"They are animals, they need a little direction, they need boundaries, and they need a little work. Just remember when you're adopting, try to put a little work into the relationship to make sure it's going to be successful," Garcia says.



Volunteers are the **Beating Heart of a Shelter**

One crucial aspect of the shelter's success are the many men and women who accumulate significant volunteer hours contributing to the health and wellness of animals there. With only five animal

control officers, one part-time kennel tech, one full-time customer service representative, and the supervisor, shelter staff rely extensively on volunteers to assist with a variety of operational and training/ socialization tasks.

The shelter has volunteers who are dog walkers, cat cuddlers, weekend cleaners, and what they call "blue shirt" volunteers, because they wear blue shirts just like staff does. The blue shirt volunteers are vetted through the Sierra Vista Police Department and have access similar to City employees: they can go behind the scenes at the facility, drive City vehicles, and access City systems.

"I don't know how the shelter would survive without these volunteers," Garcia says. "It's really humbling to see their dedication. It's so unselfish of them to give so much."

The volunteers not only help with general operating tasks like cleaning kennels, bathing animals, administering medicine, and feeding, but do crucial work towards getting animals adopted.

Volunteers walk dogs and do training exercises, giving them physical and mental stimulation that increases wellness and adoptability. They also supervise dogs during group play, noting behavioral traits like resource guarding, sociability, energy levels, and general behavior. These observations are then used in continued training and to match dogs to suitable homes.

Meanwhile, cat cuddlers know better than staff which cats can eat what, what they like to play with, which like to be brushed, and which enjoy cuddles.

The volunteers then act as ambassadors to our community, matching people with animals based on what people want and which animal would be best for that specific family or individual.

Department of Corrections inmates also assist at the shelter and play a crucial role in operations. Inmates are at the shelter Monday through Saturday to clean litter boxes and pressure wash and disinfect kennels. On Sundays, other shelter volunteers come in to clean. Their combined contributions ensure all animals have a clean and safe atmosphere.

More Ways to Help

FOSTER & SLEEPOVER PROGRAMS

The Nancy J. Brua Animal Care Center offers different levels of fostering. Residents interested in adopting an animal may pick one out to foster for up to 30 days while they decide if it's a good fit. This no commitment offering allows potential owners to take the animal home on a trial basis, with all supplies and any potential medical care covered by the shelter. If at any point the fosterer wants to return the animal or decides to adopt it within that time span, they may.

The shelter also offers a dog sleepover program where residents can take a dog home for an evening or two whether interested in potentially adopting, or simply wanting to contribute to the animal's welfare through increased exercise, attention, or observation for adoptability. Both the foster and sleepover program can give staff insight into how an animal will behave in a home and help match them with an appropriate home in the future.

If you're not interested in adopting but would like to help with getting a dog healthy, taking care of a litter of puppies, or fostering to train and help them become more adoptable, the shelter will also provide all supplies and any vet care needed for temporary foster care.





DONATIONS

Residents can also help support the shelter by providing monetary or item donations! Supplies like pet food, laundry detergent, cleaning supplies, bedding, peanut butter, and more are all happily accepted by the shelter. Anything not used on site is given back out to the community or put in the Rambo's Rummage Sale which benefits the Friends of the Sierra Vista Animal Shelter.

To make a monetary donation, residents can send a check written out to the City of Sierra Vista, add "animal shelter" to the memo line, and send it to 6799 E. Highway 90. Donations can be earmarked for pet supplies, vet care, equipment, facility needs, spay/ neuter programs, or just left general.



PAWS TO RECYCLE

Another way to contribute is to save your aluminum beverage cans and bring them to the shelter for the Paws to Recycle program. Cans can be placed in the blue bins outside the shelter at any time. The cans can also be crushed to help save space or the tabs can be removed and deposited in a separate bag to help the shelter get more money upon deposit. Shelter volunteers drive a horse trailer and flatbed full of cans up to Tucson two to four times monthly and can get anywhere from \$350 to \$700 for the load!

Not Just Par for the Course

City plans for PDS are a game changer



IERRA VISTA'S PREMIER GOLF COURSE IS SET for some exciting modifications as the City of Sierra Vista acquires it on September 6!

Pueblo del Sol, which has functioned as a traditional country club, will soon become a municipal course named the Sierra Vista Golf Center at Pueblo del Sol. The name reflects a new vision for the property as Paradigm Golf Group takes over its management and shifts to having a more welcoming, family-friendly, and fun atmosphere.

"The course is going to feel different as Paradigm gets moved in and operational," Director of Parks, Recreation, and Library Laura Wilson says. "They're really excited and want to bring more energy to the course."

While the course will still serve traditional golfers, Paradigm and the City are looking to make it more of a community gathering space and entertainment venue. One key area of focus will be the driving range. Paradigm plans to integrate Inrange technology, which will allow golfers to track and see their progress as they practice. They will also be able to play longest drive, closest to the pin, or a round at Pebble Beach with friends at the range while enjoying great food, ice-cold drinks, and rock'n music. Paradigm is also looking to add directional LED lighting there to allow for plenty of nighttime play!

The soon-to-be revamped property promises to offer a more invigorating atmosphere. At Paradigm's Dobsen Ranch Golf Course in Mesa, their clubhouse has big screen TVs, a pool table, Golden Tee Video Golf, and cornhole. The bar and restaurant even deliver to the course—all you have to do is call! When Paradigm lands in Sierra Vista, it's looking to create a similar vibe, including enabling the fleet of carts with Bluetooth.

The idea is to make golf more accessible and fun for everyone, no matter their age or skill level. While a traditional round of golf at a country club can feel very exclusive, a golf center with a variety of golf-related activities and other entertainment invites all Sierra Vista residents to come unwind and play.

"I'm looking forward to seeing the operation expand and serve more of our community," Wilson says. "It's going to be something truly unique for southern Arizona."

Residents can also expect more youth activities at the course. Paradigm loves putting clubs into the hands of kids and plans to have some free youth programming. Part of Paradigm's model is to attract new golfers and new generations of golfers by making the sport more affordable and accessible.

To that end, the golf center will transition to using GolfNow to reserve tee times and plans to use

tiered pricing. The latter will make the course more economical, especially for residents willing to golf outside of prime hours. Meanwhile, the reservation software will enable people to browse a variety of tee times, prices, and availability to plan their perfect round!

The City is also looking at ways to reconfigure the building to better facilitate larger parties, weddings, conferences, and more! Much of the infrastructure needed is already there, and with few options throughout the City, this beautiful and fun location is a great fit for expanded event space.

Want to host a bachelor party, team building event, or just have a fun night with the family? The Sierra Vista Golf Center at Pueblo del Sol will soon be the place!



Background

On July 8, Sierra Vista City Council voted to acquire the Pueblo del Sol golf course and attendant property after the City was informed by Castle & Cooke that they could not find a buyer and would be walking away from the property.

In exchange for the PDS property, which was valued at \$1.6 million in 2020, the City forgave \$609,711.31 of outstanding debt from a 1999 agreement with Castle & Cooke for a sewer interceptor.

The City then entered into a 30-day feasibility study that included assessing the property and doing inventory. The City also finalized a contract with Paradigm Golf Group who will immediately take over management of the course and also assume any operational losses.

The enthusiastic support from instructors and the community played a crucial role in turning this vision into a reality, making this year's camp a significant and exciting milestone for SVF&MS.

By empowering young women through hands-on experience and mentorship, the camp is fostering the next generation of leaders in fire and EMS services.

The camp also served as a platform for mentorship and community development. Female firefighters and medics from SVF&MS, as well as other local

departments, shared their experiences and answered questions from the participants.

"We want to inspire young women to see their potential in fire and EMS services and encourage them to consider these fields as a career," SVF&MS Engineer Michelle Knodle says.

The firewomen and camp instructors emphasized the importance of such initiatives in building a more diverse and capable workplace. They explained that Camp SPARK is not just about introducing young women to firefighting and EMS; it's about empowering them to see their potential in any field. The commitment and enthusiasm from both the participants and instructors were phenomenal, and. by participating in the camp or teaching it, they are actively paving the way for future leaders within the community.

All available slots for this transformative camp filled quickly, showcasing the community's enthusiasm and support. Given the camp's success, there are plans to make Camp SPARK an annual event.

"We see this as a pilot program that we can expand and improve upon each year. Our long-term goal is to increase participation and continue inspiring young women to pursue careers in fire and EMS." Knodle says.

The impact of Camp SPARK is already evident in the excitement and determination of its participants, who tackled tough physical challenges and supported each other, resulting in a remarkable growth in confidence throughout the day.

Trash Do's & Don'ts

Do

- Have your bin out by 7 AM with the handle towards your home
- Bag your trash and close the bag tight to prevent trash from flying out and getting on the ground
- Make sure the bin is not overfull and the lid is closed (it's up to the driver's discretion whether to empty bins that are overfull. If the driver empties the bin and trash falls on the ground, it's the customer's responsibility to pick it up)
- Place the bin at least 6 feet away from other objects including vehicles, mailboxes, fences, and basketball hoops

Don't

- Force large items into the bin or compact your trash
- Place extra trash on top of or next to the bin
- Toss ashes in the trash bin, as embers may cause a fire
- Dispose of hazardous materials like oil, fuel, paint, chemicals, hypodermic needles, prescription medication, and light bulbs. Instead, take them to an approved disposal site.
