

When it comes to offering compassionate care to those who need it, Sierra Vista Fire & Medical Services has made it a mission to exceed expectations. Always.

Now, thanks to several new initiatives, the department continues to expand the medical services it offers, while also enabling CPR-trained bystanders an opportunity to help.

This spring, Sierra Vista Fire & Medical Services is integrating the PulsePoint Respond App into its dispatch software with the support of a grant awarded by the Legacy Foundation of Southeast Arizona.

Once completed, this integration will enable anyone with the app to receive a notification when a possible cardiac arrest victim has been reported in a nearby public place. Bystanders will also be able to see where the nearest publicly located AED is located. Beginning resuscitation efforts early, while first-responders are on the way, can significantly improve a victim's chances of survival in the event of a cardiac arrest.

The department is also excited to restore its Community Awareness, Response, and Education program with the support of a Community Engagement Research grant awarded by Arizona Area Health Centers. The funding has enabled the department to hire a dedicated

part-time community paramedic who will conduct home visits to ensure patients discharged from the hospital understand how to use their medications and care for themselves so they do not need to be hospitalized again.

Referrals come primarily from Canyon Vista Medical Center and the program, which was first employed in 2015, realized a reduction of readmission rates among patients of 8 to 11 percent. This helps the department reduce its calls for service, while also improving quality of life for patients with chronic illnesses that can be treated at home.

Lastly, Sierra Vista Fire & Medical Services is now offering ambulance services to Fort Huachuca, under an innovative Intergovernmental Service Agreement that will save Fort Huachuca about \$140,000 over the next five years.

"We're happy to be able to expand our capabilities and find new, innovative ways to better serve our community and our citizens," Sierra Vista Fire Chief Ron York says.

Go Green This Spring

When this edition of *VISTAS* hits newsstands and driveways, it will still be winter in Sierra Vista but chances are it won't feel like it. Between the occasional cold spells, local residents may feel the urge to get a head start on preparing their yards and gardens for the coming spring and the City can help!



Each Wednesday, at least when there's not a holiday that week, the City offers free green waste pickups to City refuse customers. So instead of filling up their green bins with trimmings, dead branches, and weeds, local residents can bag, bundle, or box them up and schedule a special Wednesday pickup.

This saves your City money since all that yard waste gets diverted away from the landfill, where we have to pay costly tipping fees. Instead, these organic materials are turned into high quality compost and mulch. This is then sold back to area residents at the dirt cheap (pardon the pun) price of \$15 per cubic yard for compost and \$8 per cubic yard for mulch, cash or checks only.

The City's refuse service operates as an enterprise fund, which means it's just like a business. The savings we realize by diverting these materials from the landfill minimizes what we need to charge residents for their refuse service. Ensuring recyclables—but not green waste—end up in the blue bin also helps to reduce tipping fees the City incurs.

So save yourself some money in the long-term by calling (520) 458-7530 by 5:00 p.m. each Monday to schedule a free green waste pickup that Wednesday. Then, if you've got a green thumb, stop by the City's compost facility at 7201 E. Highway 90 from 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday to buy compost and mulch for the coming spring.

The City's green waste and compost program is just one way we strive to save our taxpayers money, while also being good stewards of the environment. On top of that, it's just an easy, convenient way to get a head start on your spring cleaning.

Sprucing up City Spaces

It's never too early to get started on some spring cleaning, and the City has been doing its part to spruce up public facilities and open spaces.





I'm sure many residents were sorry to see the Sierra Vista Public Library temporarily close its doors this month but the wait is well worth the outcome. The entire facility's carpet was replaced, which required a complete closure to ensure the work was done as safely and efficiently as possible.

In conjunction with the recent roof replacement project and the construction of a new outdoor stage and xeriscape garden area next to its entrance, the library has seen some major upgrades in the last several months. These investments will ensure one of the City's most popular and beautiful facilities continues to meet our community's needs for years to come.

The City also completed some major cleanups on open spaces near our ball fields and City facilities located south of Tacoma Street. Mesquite trees were pruned and understory brush, trash, and debris were removed from the open land, improving aesthetics

and public safety. It builds on the progress made on state lands last year in conjunction with the Arizona Department of Forestry and Fire Management.

This work also has the benefit of reducing the risk of high-intensity brush fires, which are a persistent danger in Arizona and may pose an early threat if we don't see much winter rain. Homeowners can clear up the brush and flammable debris around their own houses and structures to help protect them in the event of a wildfire.

A Modern Approach to Street Maintenance

A new, high-tech approach to assessing the condition of City streets will soon enable the Public Works Department to maximize its use of available street maintenance dollars to ensure our local roadways are kept in the best possible shape.

In the past, City streets were assessed based on institutional knowledge and hands-on evaluations conducted by street workers. Now a new computer-based survey using lasers and other advanced technologies will be conducted this spring thanks to funding from the Sierra Vista Metropolitan Planning Organization. This assessment is expected to wrap up in May and will be repeated every three to five years.

This new approach to assessing street conditions will better track deterioration over time and will give the City an understanding of what's going on just under the surface of local streets.

"This will enable us to be more precise and proactive in how we allocate the resources we have available for street maintenance. It helps us ensure we're making the most of every dollar," Public Works Department Director Sharon Flissar says.

In addition, the Public Works
Department will be replacing the old
chip seal surface of sections of Moson
Road and Corral Road with a double
thick chip seal within the current fiscal
year. The plan also includes funding for
pavement replacement on Camino Bella
Rosa and three adjacent cul-de-sacs in
the Canyon de Flores community.

The City remains committed to maintaining the more than 600 lane miles of City-owned local streets to meet the needs of many thousands of area residents and traveling motorists who rely on them every day.



City Expands Customer Service at Ball Fields

As local leagues begin using City ball fields in 2018, they will see additional support from Leisure and Library Services staff as part of an effort to expand customer service.

City staff members will now be available during games held by local leagues playing baseball, softball, soccer and other sports, after typical working hours. This will enable them to ensure the fields are properly prepared for league play, address any questions or concerns that may arise, ensure rules are followed, and assist with basic services.

The City will also conduct additional field preparations that were being covered by sports leagues, like painting in lines, while also checking for hazards and ensuring amenities like pitching mounds are up to

specifications before games. Having staff on hand will also help resolve any disputes over reservations or questions regarding rules governing City ball fields and parks, which were updated last year.

"We're also starting to engage sports leagues to see how the City can best support efforts to bring tournaments to the community," says Laura Wilson, director of Leisure and Library Services. "Tournaments can bring new people, and new dollars, into Sierra Vista and I'm excited to see what we can come up with together."



VOTING FOR SIERRA VISTA CITY COUNCIL

The Sierra Vista City Council recently voted to eliminate the requirement to hold a Primary Election for the nonpartisan mayoral and city council races, so all candidates will appear on the General Election ballot in November. This ensures the highest possible number of voters decide which candidates earn seats.

Three City Council seats and the mayor's seat are up for election on Tuesday, November 6, 2018. While the Sierra Vista City Council race will not appear on the Primary Election ballot, voters will still be able to weigh in on other local and state elections in August.

RUNNING FOR SIERRA VISTA CITY COUNCIL

Changes to state law have altered the process of running for Sierra Vista City Council seats, eliminating the need to file a Statement of Organization and campaign finance reports unless a candidate intends to raise and spend a combined total of at least \$1,100.

Now candidates not intending to raise and spend that much may wait to file any official paperwork until petition signatures and other basic nominating paperwork is submitted between April 30 and May 30, at 5:00 p.m. For this year's election, candidates must submit petitions containing a minimum of 338

signatures and a maximum of 676 from Sierra Vista voters.

Candidates are urged to keep accurate accounting of campaign fundraising and expenses if there is a possibility they will reach the threshold. Once a combined total of \$1,100 is raised and spent, candidates must submit reports accounting for all campaign committee revenues and expenditures.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

Reviewing the publicity pamphlet—which is mailed to voters and available on the Cochise County Elections Department website—ahead of time will help voters prepare before casting their ballot at a Vote Center.

Voters can also head to the county's website (listed below) to watch a video about the new touch screen equipment

being used at Vote Centers, so they know how to use it on Election Day.

Finally, remember that all registered voters can use any one of the county's 18 Vote Centers from 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Election Day, no matter where they live. Whether voting early or on Election Day, casting a ballot is convenient and simple!
