Celebrating Old Traditions and Making New Ones

he holidays are a season when each of us finds time to gather with friends and family to enjoy familiar activities and meals that, no matter where we are, foster a feeling of home.

And as we honor Sierra Vista's traditions and history, the City is also poised to make major improvements in the West End, the part of town where our community began. This project will use the "Complete Streets" approach to create infrastructure that accommodates bicycles and pedestrians in addition to cars, while also providing amenities to enhance the business district. Saving the Santas



ince they were first debuted in 2006, 53 hand-painted Old World Santas encircling the trees in Veterans Memorial Park became a hallmark of the holiday season in Sierra Vista.

Many local families made visiting the Santas a tradition. Some would take an annual photo with a special Santa, measuring their children's growth by having them pose alongside their favorite jolly giant.

Former Sierra Vista mayor Tom Hessler and his wife Nancy spearheaded the effort to create the Santas, working with local artists Susan Bell, Sue Ann Vannoy, and Laura Sudduth, in addition to numerous other volunteers, to create these handmade pieces of art. The Santas were inspired by traditions and representations from around

the world and each included a narrative or poem telling that Santa's story.

But the Santas' plywood construction had its limitations and despite efforts to minimize weathering and prevent wear and tear, the original Old World Santas deteriorated over time. In 2018 the Santas were no longer fit for display.

So the City worked with Stronghold Signs to have the original Santa artwork reproduced on highperformance vinyl and mounted on 4-foot by 8-foot weather-resistant aluminum substrate. This will create Santas that can last for decades.

To fund this project, the City developed a "Save the Santas" campaign and turned to the community for help. And individuals, groups, and organizations

quickly rose to the occasion by making \$550 donations to sponsor Santas for reproduction.

Since the Save the Santas campaign was launched early in 2019, all but seven of the 53 Santas have been sponsored. These Santas are being reproduced and the community is invited to see them on display at the Annual Tree Lighting Ceremony: A Light to Remember on Friday, December 6, from 4:00 to 9:0 0 p.m.

"We're overjoyed to see the outpouring of support for these Santas and look forward to celebrating the return of this beloved holiday tradition to Veterans Memorial Park this year," says Judy Hector, marketing and communications manager for the City.



Honoring Family and Fostering That Hometown Feeling

When Gloria Burek first visited Sierra Vista, her friends took her to see the Old World Santas and to read all their descriptions.

"I thought it was beautiful," Burek says.

It was her brother Gerald Burek who first moved to Sierra Vista after falling in love with it on a business trip. He called his sister Gloria and told her, "This is the place to retire. The weather is perfect. It's a nice city with no traffic."

Gloria and her brother lived most of their lives in Michigan and it just so happened she had recently fractured her arm and wrist shoveling snow, so she took it as a sign that it was time for a change. After visiting Sierra Vista herself, Gloria decided to join her brother here in the fall of 2006.

Gloria's brother Gerald died in 2017 and when Gloria saw one of the Santas in need of saving, she instantly thought of him. The Buckskin Santa sports a buckskin coat with golden brown suede and beige fleece just like a coat Gerald would wear. And this Santa is seen walking beside a deer, which also fit perfectly because Gerald loved seeing the deer that would visit his home here.

"He loved Christmas. He loved everything about it. He loved the religion and he really celebrated the birth of Jesus," Gloria says. So she decided to sponsor the Buckskin Santa in honor of her late brother, Gerald Burek.

"We want to promote this little City of Sierra Vista and hold it in our hearts and continue to keep the City up, keep it clean, and nicely decorated," Gloria says.

The Buckskin Santa is one of two saved Santas that are being featured as limited run ornaments that will go on sale at the Annual Tree Lighting



Ceremony on Friday, December 6. The other ornament features the Swedish Tompte Santa, which was sponsored by Sierra Vista native Jill Brown, who has a unique connection to that Santa.

Brown sponsored the Santa in honor of her mother-in-law, Barbara Rydberg Brown, who is the great grand niece of Swedish Poet Laureate Viktor Rydberg, the author of the original poem "Tomten," which was later adapted by Astrid Lindgren into a classic Swedish children's book.

Brown was happy to be able to honor her own family's heritage by sponsoring the Santa and thinks restoring the Old World Santas is a great idea because it's a tradition that fosters a sense of home.

"When you're driving down Fry Boulevard and you see all the Santas there around the trees, it gives you that hometown type feeling," Brown says. "You feel proud that those Santas are in Sierra Vista."

The reproduced Old World Santas will go on display in Veterans Memorial Park at the Annual Tree Lighting Ceremony: A Light to Remember on Friday, December 6, from 4:00 to 9:00 p.m.

This beloved annual event has been expanded this year to include snow, a skating rink, a holiday-themed obstacle course, and games! The Sierra Vista Community Band will offer live entertainment starting at 5:00 p.m. and there will be free cookies and hot chocolate for the whole family to enjoy. And of course, Santa himself is set to share a special gift with the children (while supplies last), once the tree lighting ceremony occurs at 5:30 p.m.

And limited run ornaments featuring the Buckskin Santa and Swedish Tompte Santa will be on sale for \$10 each at the event until sold out. Any proceeds will provide seed money for future Santa ornaments and help start a fund for future Old World Santa display maintenance so we can ensure this tradition survives the test of time.

City Restores Toilet Rebate Program



he City of Sierra Vista will provide a rebate of \$50 to \$100 for qualifying residents who replace a less efficient toilet with a low-flow model that meets the Environmental Protection Agency's WaterSense program standards under a rejuvenated program announced in September.

The City first launched its popular residential toilet rebate program in 2001. Then, in 2013, the program was expanded through a partnership with The Cochise Water Project to include commercial properties until that grant-funded nonprofit wrapped up its work in 2017. The newly restored program now builds upon decades of work to conserve water in Sierra Vista, which was recognized by the EPA as the first community in the nation to adopt WaterSense program standards as requirements for future residential development in 2013.

By 2012, the City replaced more than 2,600 toilets, saving more than 24 million gallons of water per year. From 2013 through 2017 the Cochise Water Project, in partnership with the City, replaced nearly 4,500 toilets, saving about 45 million gallons per year.

"Historically the City typically sold out of rebates

every year when running the program. So we encourage interested residents to act quickly and take advantage of this opportunity to save money on their water bill and help our community conserve this vital resource," Community Development Director Matt McLachlan says.

The City will provide rebates of up to \$100 per unit to replace about 150 toilets in the current fiscal year, which ends June 30. There is a limit of two per household and rebates will be provided on a firstcome, first-served basis. They are only available to City of Sierra Vista residential sewer customers.

The rebate amount ranges from \$50 to \$100 and is dependent on the water savings generated by the replacement, with greater savings resulting in greater rebates. Qualifying toilets must use at least 1.6 gallons per flush and the replacement toilets must be EPA WaterSense-approved models that use 1.28 gallons per flush or less.

Input Sought on Fry Boulevard **Improvements**

The City of Sierra Vista will host two public open house meetings on Wednesday, November 13, to introduce an improvement project on Fry Boulevard in the City's historic West End District.

Both meetings will be held at the Sierra Suites Hotel, 391 E. Fry Boulevard, in Sierra Vista. The first meeting will be from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. and the second from 5:30 to

The City is working to redesign the section of West Fry Boulevard between South Carmichael Avenue and North Garden Avenue using the "Complete Streets" approach. This approach will make the section of road one that accommodates bicycles and pedestrians in addition to automobiles and provides public-friendly amenities to enhance the business district.

Project team members will share introductory ideas for improving the area and ask the public to share their thoughts about potential design elements intended to revitalize the West End District.

Representatives of the City and planning team will be on hand to share information about the improvement project, answer questions, and take public comments that will be considered in the final design of this redevelopment effort.

Buena Grads Win #RenewYourBlue Upcycling Contest



team of three Buena High School graduates raced past the competition in the City of Sierra Vista's #RenewYourBlue Upcycling Contest by earning 272 votes with an extraordinary video entry showing off a blue recycling bin they converted into a working electric-powered vehicle.

The team comprised of Evan Archer, Atkin Hyatt, and Charles Penny graduated from Buena High School in 2018 and spent their summer vacation creating "Trashla," a recycling bin transformed into a go-kart, using an old skateboard motor Archer had on hand. Divided between attending Arizona State University and University of Arizona, the team recently reunited back home to receive their \$250 grand prize gift card provided by Ace Hardware. All three were also members of Buena's Nifty Engineering Robotics Design Squad (NERDS).

And the trio has further plans for Trashla when they visit home over Thanksgiving break. Thanks to a contribution of about \$407 from TransWorld Network, Corp. (TWN Communications), the Buena grads will be able to upgrade Trashla's motor so it can pull along several other converted blue bins in tow. This would create a blue bin train kids could ride in, which could be used as an educational tool to help promote engineering and the importance of reducing, reusing, and recycling.

"I think the concept of upcycling and recycling is essential for today's world. I believe if we don't make a difference the world will only degrade into a worse state than it was yesterday," Archer says.

The team was surprised by all the positive reactions to their video entry, which made the rounds on social media both in Sierra Vista and on KOLD News 13 in Tucson.

"I honestly didn't think the whole thing would have gotten as big as it did but I'm happy to see how positive a response it got," Hyatt says.

"We love the community, and the good reactions to Trashla only reminded us of why," Penny says.

Second-place winner Mary Berg says she credits her Facebook friends for helping give the Buena grads a run for their money.

Berg's entry of an elaborately decorated compost bin garnered 176 votes in the seven-day voting period and she received a gym membership or piece of personal exercise equipment of up to \$150 provided by Rainey Pain & Performance. She also created a rainwater harvesting barrel using another blue bin and thinks everyone should be finding ways to reuse materials at home.

"I think it's great. We should do that all the time," Berg said.

Third place finisher and local artist Tiffany Brown agrees. Finding a new use for old materials is often central to her artwork, so this upcycling contest was a great fit.

"I'm extremely passionate about this ... I absolutely love being able to take time, put in elbow grease, and turn it into something that just surprises people," Brown said.

And her entry showcased that creativity well. Brown transformed her blue bin into a "traveling puppet theater" complete with stage curtains, a backstage entrance, and a beautiful hand-painted night sky, garnering 87 votes. Brown earned two reusable cold beverage tumblers and two \$15 gift cards provided by Broxton's Coffee.



"Hopefully this contest helps inspire others to think of ways to reduce what they consume and reuse what materials they can in their daily lives," City of Sierra Vista Public Information Officer Adam Curtis says. "We want people to continue recycling with us at the City's drop-off center but changing our behavior as consumers can make an even greater impact on the environment."

The City received more than a dozen entries, which garnered 714 votes in the seven-day voting period. Other entries demonstrated how bins can be used for rainwater harvesting, gardening, storage, and even for cleaning pool filters.

SEACOM Agencies See Benefits of Regional Dispatch



ith several subscribers coming on board in 2019, the Southeastern Arizona Communications Center (SEACOM) now provides regional dispatch services to nine agencies that are already seeing benefits from the integrated regional communications center.

Established by an intergovernmental agreement between the City of Sierra Vista and Cochise County, SEACOM has steadily increased its membership since going live in July, 2018. The Palominas Fire District joined in September, the National Park Service Southeast Arizona Group came on board in August, and the Huachuca City Police Department was integrated in February.

"SEACOM has been great for Huachuca City," says Matthew Williams, city manager of Huachuca City. The town will save nearly \$120,000 each year by shifting from running its own dispatch center to becoming a SEACOM subscriber.

"It wasn't just a matter of savings, SEACOM is also a superior product," Williams says. The integrated communications system enables the other local law enforcement officers to hear Huachuca City Police Department calls, ensuring a rapid response and seamless communications in the event of a significant incident.

"Our officers now have more abundant and faster resource availability because of SEACOM," Huachuca City Police Department Chief James Thies says. "We were the first additional public safety agency to come on board and we're proud to help blaze the trail for future law enforcement agencies that will benefit from integrating with SEACOM in the future."

As additional subscribers continue to come on board, the City of Sierra Vista and Cochise County will realize reductions in annual operational costs, while also seeing benefits in efficiency through improved inter-agency coordination. And subscribers will soon gain an additional benefit, as SEACOM prepares to launch Emergency Medical Dispatch software in the coming months.

Software Will Enhance Medical, Fire Dispatching

The SEACOM Joint Powers Authority Board recently approved the implementation of Emergency Medical Dispatch software, which will bring new capabilities never before employed in Cochise County.

The intuitive software will make the call taking process faster and more efficient, while also standardizing it. A nationally-recognized system will guide dispatchers through each call, providing prompts for questions to ask and then automatically prioritizing the call based on the caller's responses.

It will also give dispatchers instructions to provide the caller while first responders are in route. This removes liability concerns, enabling the dispatchers to give nationally-vetted instructions to callers for whatever situation they find themselves in.

"This is a huge enhancement for SEACOM and it's a major benefit for its subscribers and the communities they serve," Sierra Vista Fire & Medical Services Chief Brian Jones says. "It will ensure dispatchers are always on the same page regardless of their experience levels and will make the medical dispatching process more efficient."

The new software is expected to go live in spring 2020 for fire and medical calls, with a module for law enforcement planned for implementation the following fiscal year, which starts July 1. This staggered implementation follows the recommended best practices.

or 48 years, Sierra Vista Fire & Medical Services firefighters have played the role of Santa's elves by helping local families in need ensure their children have something fun to unwrap for Christmas.

The department's annual Christmas Toy Drive is once again ramping up in preparation for bringing a little Christmas joy to about 250 to 300 area families. Firefighters and community volunteers fill hundreds of blue bags for delivery day each year and can always use help collecting, bagging, and distributing toys for children ages birth to 12 years old.

Holiday Fire Safety Tips

The holiday season is a time to gather together with loved ones, cook traditional meals, and decorate our homes. But these same activities that fill our hearts with cheer can also pose some added fire danger or risk of injury. Keep these tips in mind to enjoy the holidays safely.



- NEVER LEAVE CANDLES UNTENDED. According to the National Fire Protection Association, about half of home decoration fires in December are started by candles.
- KEEP DECORATIONS AWAY FROM HEAT SOURCES. About one-fifth of home decoration fires start in the kitchen, so be mindful of any decorations placed near the stove, light fixtures, or any heat sources.
- MIND THE STOVE AND OVEN. Christmas and Thanksgiving are the top two days when it comes to home cooking fires. With many guests in the home, it's important to not get distracted and always keep an eye on what's cooking.
- KEEP PETS AND KIDS OUT OF THE KITCHEN. With so much to prepare, the kitchen can become a frantic place. A dog or young child underfoot can be a recipe for injuries and accidents.
- USE CAUTION WITH FIREWORKS AND SPARKLERS. Even just a sparkler can cause serious burns if mishandled. Remember, fireworks can only be used on private property and no aerial fireworks that explode are allowed.
- CHECK YOUR SMOKE ALARM BATTERIES. If you're unable to check them on your own, the Citizen's Fire Academy Alumni conducts free smoke detector checks and battery replacements. Call (520) 417-4400 to learn more.

Energy Initiative Brings New Turf and Lights to Sports Fields



he City of Sierra Vista's energy initiative with Schneider Electric has made major headway since getting started in August as crews make lasting improvements not only to sports fields but to facilities throughout the City.

Users of the fields located along Tacoma Drive can already enjoy new LED lights that now better illuminate the action, while using less energy and resulting in less light pollution due to their more downward focus. And, while the lighting work has wrapped up, crews are now busy installing artificial turf at the Domingo Paiz and Cyr Center soccer fields.

These improvements to sports amenities will build upon the City's recent work to make its fields tournament-ready and to attract more and larger tournaments. This has already brought new visitors and dollars to our community and the improvements now underway will bolster those efforts.

"We appreciate the support and patience of our local players and sports clubs as we complete lasting improvements that will benefit our local residents, while also bringing in additional revenue for Sierra Vista and introducing more people to our extraordinary community," Leisure & Library Services Director Laura Wilson says.

The City's energy initiative includes about \$14 million in projects, many of which will generate guaranteed energy savings to help pay back the cost over the next 10 years. Several projects will also help the City conserve water. And the projects cover much more than improvements to sports fields, as the initiative has enabled the City to catch up on key maintenance priorities that were deferred during the last decade due to an economic recession.

Additional projects in the initiative include replacing the wave machine at The Cove, replacing the electrical pedestals at Veterans Memorial Park to support vendors at events and create more flexible event layouts, replacing interior and exterior lights at facilities throughout the City with LEDs, upgrades at the Environmental Operations Park, and replacing heating and cooling systems at multiple facilities.

While the wave machine project is unique in that it will not generate new energy or water savings, the unit will be right-sized and operate more efficiently than the original machine. It is expected to draw additional users and dollars to The Cove.


