Small Business Grant

- 24 Businesses Reviewed in the application process (Plus 14 businesses did not qualify or complete application)
- 9 Grants as Microenterprise (\$66,050)
- 2 Special Economic Development Grants (\$20,000)
- **Total \$86,050** (of the total \$120,000) for businesses that have not received other assistance; funding completed on June 29th
 - o 3 Business Owners Withdrew (had received other federal assistance)
 - 2 Business Did Not Complete Application after initial self-certification
 - o 7 Business Applicants have received PPP and applications held
 - 1 business did not qualify due to income level
- Of the original 24 owner applicants, 21 received federal support directly from the SBA/PPP or through the City of Sierra Vista CDBG Grant.

United Way Emergency Crisis Fund

- Subrecipient Agreement with United Way of Sierra Vista and Cochise County, Inc. executed on May 14, 2020 to operate the Grombacher Assistance Program (GAP) Emergency Crisis Fund
- Funding to be disbursed in four equal monthly installments for June – September 2020
- First grant installment of \$9,974.25 was issued on June 5, 2020.
- In June, funds were used for food distribution (via Sierra Vista Dream Center) and employment assistance (provided three of nine resume writing workshops for civilian and federal resumes).
